ACADEMY PASS PROGRAM

The Academy of Lifelong Learning offers members a unique opportunity to explore a wide range of academic subjects through the Academy Pass Program. This program allows members to audit one undergraduate course per semester at Eastern Illinois University—with no tuition, fees, tests, or grades.

Whether you're diving into a long-time interest or exploring something entirely new, this is a great way to engage with college-level learning in a relaxed, supportive environment. Courses are audited on a space-available basis, as priority is given to degree-seeking EIU students.

To participate, individuals must be current Academy members by paying the annual membership fee. Registration for the Academy Pass Program is managed by Academy staff during the two weeks prior to each semester, based on available openings in selected courses.

Course instructors determine the level of participation expected from auditing students. Your insights and thoughtful observations are usually welcomed, keeping in mind the diverse mix of learners in each classroom.

- An active EIU email account during the semester

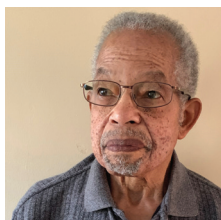

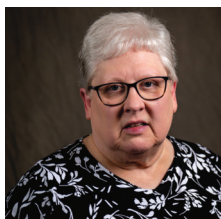

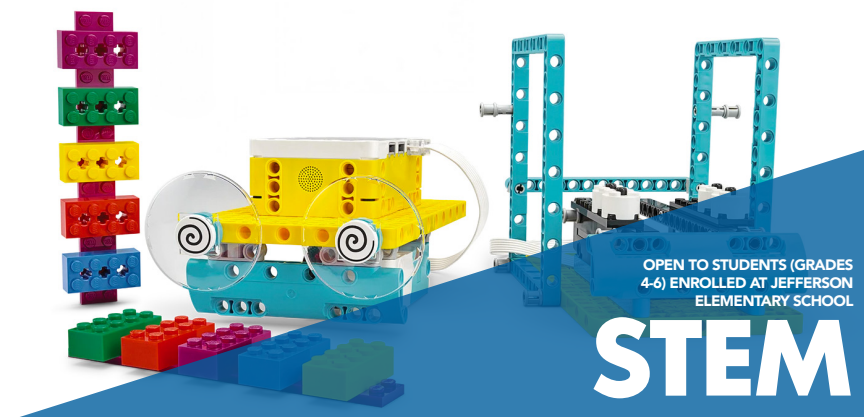

QPR stands for question, persuade, and refer — the 3 simple steps anyone can learn to help save a life from suicide.

Just as people trained in CPR help save thousands of lives each year, people trained in QPR learn how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer someone to help. Each year, thousands of Americans, like you, are saying “yes” to saving the life of a friend, colleague, sibling, or neighbor.

Gatekeepers can be anyone, but include parents, friends, neighbors, teachers, ministers, doctors, nurses, office supervisors, squad leaders, foremen, police officers, advisors, caseworkers, firefighters, and many others who are strategically positioned to recognize and refer someone at risk of suicide.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

1. Recognize someone at risk for suicide
2. Demonstrate increased knowledge of intervention skills
3. Describe knowledge of referral resources and how to refer someone to help

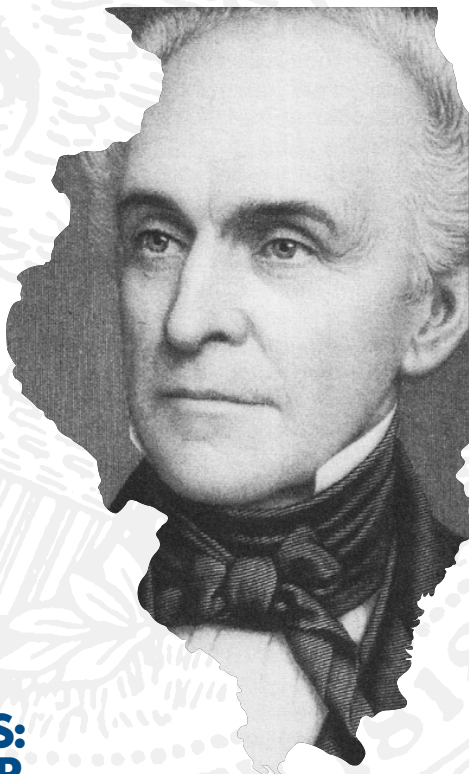

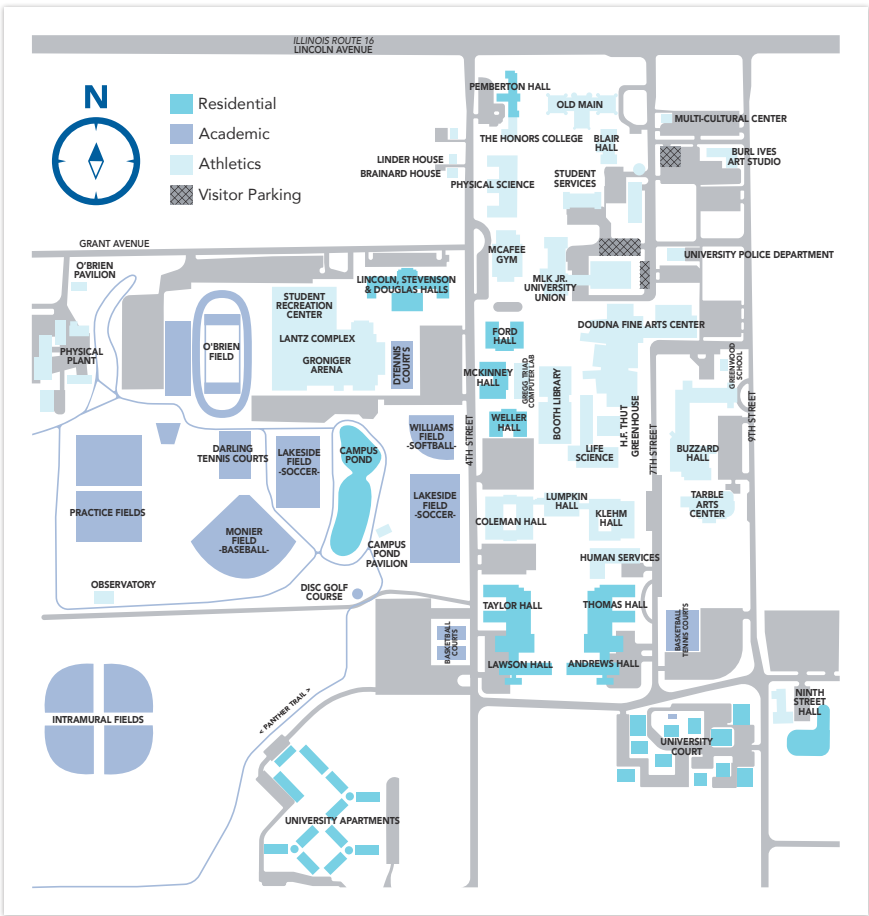
