2. 05-39, HIS 4860, Modern South Asia, (New Course Proposal)

HIS 4860. Modern South Asia. (3-0-3) S. Mod South Asia. Studies the political, social, cultural and economic history of South Asia from 1600 - c. 1960. WI. Prerequisite: None

3. <u>05-40</u>, HIS 4930, Public History: Meaning and Method (New Course Proposal)

Dr. Elder presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council.

The proposal was approved unanimously with an effective date of Fall 2006.

HIS 4930. Public History: Meaning and Method. (3-0-3) F,S,SU. Public History. An introduction to public history that explores how conflicting interpretations of the past promoted by local amateurs, museum professionals, documentary producers and academic historians shape the public's understanding of the past. Prerequisite: None
