IMPORTANT QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER WHEN CHOOSING A UNIVERSITY TO STUDY THE FIELD OF COMMUNICATION DISORDERS & SCIENCE

WILL I HAVE CLINICAL EXPERIENCE AS AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT?



- In Illinois, EIU is the ONLY public university to give all undergraduate students (who are in the major for more than two years) a client to treat. You will shadow and assist another clinician for one semester, then you will have your own client for one semester.
- Three private universities in Illinois also provide undergraduate clinical experience, but the tuition is 3 to 5 times more expensive than EIU.

HOW MANY CLASSES ABOUT TREATING SPEECH OR LANGUAGE DISORDERS ARE IN THE PROGRAM? ARE CLASSES GUARANTEED?



- EIU requires undergraduate students take 10 classes about how to evaluate and treat communication disorders in addition to 6 communication science and normal development classes. Some universities offer only (or mostly) the science and normal development courses.
- YES, Seats in all EIU CDS classes are guaranteed for majors.

WHAT PERCENTAGE OF UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS GET ACCEPTED IN GRADUATE SCHOOL?



- Students need to attend graduate school to be a speech-language pathologist or audiologist
- Most students with a 3.3 GPA or above are admitted to a graduate program in the field. Students with higher GPAs and strong letters of recommendation often have multiple offers of admission and offers of some funding to help with graduate school. At EIU, small class sizes, clinical supervision, and faculty advising allow professors to know undergraduate students well and write personalized letters of recommendation.
- High school seniors with a 3.75 GPA or above and EIU juniors with a 3.5 GPA or above can apply for DIRECT or EARLY ADMISSION to EIU's graduate program (see brochure). If you want to stay at EIU, this saves time, stress and money.

IS THERE AN EARLY ADMISSION ACCELERATED GRADUATE PROGRAM "FAST TRACK"?



- Many students with dual credit or AP credit in high school finish the undergraduate program in 3 years
- EIU's graduate program has 1 year (summer-fall-spring-summer) of on-campus courses and clinical practicum followed by two semesters of full time medical and school internships that can be near home or other places based on student preference
- Therefore, students on the accelerated "fast track" are finished with both undergraduate and graduate courses in 4 years and have their master's degree finished in 5 years.
- There is an early admission option where students don't have to apply to other graduate programs if they meet the criteria



Speech-Language Pathologist

Consider majoring in **speech-language pathology/communication disorders & sciences** at **Eastern Illinois University**. Universities offer very different experiences in the major. EIU has undergraduate clinical experience, high acceptance to grad school, career flexible study plans for many options and back-up plans, full-time 14-week internships in BOTH the school and medial setting in graduate school, very high scores on national exam, and much more.

Help Children in Schools, Early Intervention, Clinics

SLPs work with **Children in a Variety of Settings** including: birth-3 early intervention home or clinic services, preschools, elementary schools, high schools, hospitals, NICU, clinics, private practice.

SLPs work with Children with:

speech sound errors, spoken language delays, autism, reading difficulties, augmentative communication, stuttering, feeding and swallowing difficulties, hearing impairments

Salary in Schools or other 9-10 month setting (ASHA 2024 schools survey).

Median salary with 1-5 years experience was \$63,000, with 10-20 years experience median salary was \$75,000. Higher salaries in urban compared to rural settings. Median hourly pay (rather than salary & benefits) was \$50-55 per hour

Help Adults in Medical Settings, Home Health, Clinics

SLPs work with **Adults in a Variety of Settings** including: hospitals, home health care, residential health care facilities, clinics, private practice. In 2023, 40% of SLPs worked in some type of health care setting.

SLPs work with Adults with:

Aphasia, apraxia, dysarthria, cognitive and executive function disorders, swallowing difficulties, stuttering, voice disorders, hearing impairments. Many clients have had strokes, traumatic brain injury, head & neck cancer, neurological conditions that affect speech motor system such as Parkinsons, ALS, etc.

Salary in Health Care 12-month (ASHA 2023 health care survey) Median salary with 1-3 years experience was \$74,000, with 19 + years experience median salary was \$98,000-\$100,000. Median salary clinical service provider \$82,000, for admin/supervisors \$105,000. Median hourly pay (rather than salary & benefits) was \$50 per hour.





Audiologist

Consider majoring in **Communication Disorders & Sciences** at **Eastern Illinois University**. EIU has undergraduate courses in audiology, aural rehabilitation, sign language, clinical experience & high acceptance to grad school for Audiology.

What Do Audiologists Do?

- Audiologists work with patients of all ages from newborns to elderly who present with hearing and balance disorders.
- Audiologists evaluate, diagnose, and treat a variety of hearing problems.
- They supervise & conduct new-born hearing screenings
- They assess the candidacy of persons with hearing loss for hearing aids and cochlear implants and provide fitting, programming, and audiologic rehabilitation to ensure the best possible outcomes.
- They manage hearing conservation programs, provide tinnitus retraining therapy, perform cerumen management, participate in forensic audiology and evaluate auditory processing disorders.
- They counsel and educate teachers, older adults, children and their families about hearing loss
- Audiologists serve on multi-disciplinary teams with other professionals including physicians, physical therapists, optometrists, teachers, and speech-language pathologists and make medical referrals

Minors & "Back-Up" Plans with Major in Communication Disorders & Sciences (CDS)

- * Many people with a major in CDS go on to grad school to be a Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP) or Audiologist BUT with planning there are many other graduate programs or career options that can be pursued
- Consider Minors, concentrations of classes, or a double major that reflect your potential career interests
- & Build a deliberate pathway to graduate school and beyond with options and alternatives

STUDY PLANS WITH THE CDS MAJOR OR MINOR THAT KEEP YOUR OPTIONS OPEN

Note: if you know you would like to be an SLP or Audiologist but you are concerned about the length of study with graduate school, a 3 year option for the major is available. This is best for students who have 15 credits or more of AP credit or dual credit from high school, have strong study skills and grades, and would prefer to be finished with undergrad in 3 years rather than focusing on minors and other coursework that gives more flexibility in options for advanced study and career paths.

SCHOOL SUPPORT PERSONNEL APPLICATION OPPORTUNITIES AT EIU



Speech-Language Pathologists, School Counselors, and School Psychologists are all considered to be "non-teaching" school support personnel and typically receive similar higher paying salaries on school pay scales. All of these professions require a 60-semester hour master's degree to work in their professions. With a CDS major and a psychology minor consisting of a specific set of psychology courses, undergraduates at EIU can explore all three professions as an undergraduate and apply to any or all 3 of these graduate programs during their senior year.

SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS

School Psychologists provide direct support to students and also consult with other professionals (i.e., school counselors, school social workers), teachers, and family members to improve individual support strategies, enhance school-wide practices and policies, and collaborate with members of the community to coordinate needed services. School psychologists also help schools: improve academic achievement, promote mental health awareness and support, diagnose learning and intellectual disabilities, create and provide safe and positive school atmospheres, strengthen family-school relationships, improve school wide assessment and monitoring student progress in academics and behavior.

Graduate School Application Process and Opportunities

With the set of electives listed above, you can apply for <u>School Psychology</u> Master Programs at EIU, Loyola, Illinois State University, Western Illinois University, the Chicago School of Professional Psychology, and more.

SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY AT EIU Typically 25-30 applications received for 10 spots. Prefer GRE in 50% percentile or better. GPA of 3.5. Opportunities with the Academic Intervention Clinic on campus, full-time internship. Accredited. 100% employment.

SCHOOL COUNSELORS

School Counselors work in elementary, middle, and high schools in which they provide support for emotional and behavioral development as well as guidance for college and career opportunities. Some school counselors work at the college level, specializing in career counseling and workforce development. Others work in healthcare or social service agencies. School counselors encourage student success within the school environment by helping individuals develop academic and social skills. School counselors also aid students dealing with emotional, social, mental health, and behavioral issues that threaten their success as healthy individuals. They evaluate students' interests and abilities; provide guidance lessons and counseling; and collaborate with parents and teachers to create plans to help achieve student success. School counselors may also help students develop effective study habits, overcome behavioral problems, develop career plans, explore college options, report possible cases of abuse, and maintain records. They sometimes encounter complex issues such as bullying, suicide, addiction, and abuse.

SCHOOL COUNSELING AT EIU Accepts 50% of applications, 15 per year of approximately 30 apps, >3.0 GPA; 3.3/3.4 is competitive. Clinical Mental Health - 15 slots for approximately 40 applications. Accredited.

SPEECH-LANGUAGE THERAPY FRESHMAN DIRECT ADMISSION TO GRAD SCHOOL PROGRAM



FOR HIGH ACHIEVING HIGH SCHOOL APPLICANTS

Based on a competitive admission process, a limited number of first semester freshman students will be accepted into the Master's of Science Speech-Language Therapy program through the Freshman Direct Admit Process (see back for qualification and application information).

Direct Admit students maintain their GUARANTEED SPOT in the EIU grad program if they keep a 3.5 or above major and cumulative university GPA in their undergraduate courses and meet the requirements for Essential Professional Functions in undergraduate coursework.

Students automatically begin graduate coursework when they have completed undergraduate pre-requisites.

For students with some dual credit or AP classes, an accelerated option is available. Students who enroll in at least four 2000-level CDS courses in their first year, may complete:

- + all undergraduate requirements within 3 years,
- + all on-campus graduate coursework and practicum within 4 years,
- + full-time medical and school internships throughout Illinois or out- of-state and graduate with a master's degree within 5 years

- + Clinical shadowing and clinical practicum as an undergraduate student
- + Extra-curricular opportunities such as mentor in the STEP College Autism program, and social and extra learning opportunities with the NSSHLA student group, bilingual journal club or ASL club
- + Faculty-led therapy abroad and study abroad opportunities
- + University and/or Department Honors
- + Flexible study plans that keep options open or allow for focused study such as "pre-therapy", "pre-med", business, bi-lingual, and more.
- + Faculty work closely and use applied case teaching
- + High certification test scores and choices for employment

- + Interest in the Speech Therapy (Speech-Language Pathology)
- High school senior who is admitted to Eastern Illinois University (EIU) with a declared major in Communication Disorders and Sciences (CDS)
- Meets Academic Achievement standards:
 - High school cumulative GPA of 3.75 (on a 4.0 scale)

• SAT 1230+ or ACT composite 26+, with a high school cumulative GPA of 3.5 to 3.74 or upper 10% of high school graduating class

APPLICATION PROCESS

FALL EARLY DECISION APPLICATION

- + Apply and be accepted to EIU by Nov 1
- + Send email stating intention to be considered for Direct Admit program with resume attached to Dr. Rebecca Throneburg at rmthroneburg@eiu.edu by Nov 1
- + Schedule in-person Q&A meeting about Direct Admit with Dr. Throneburg or Dr. Anthony during an on-campus EIU visit or schedule a zoom meeting with them. Meeting can be completed any time in the fall prior to Nov 15. Contact Dr. Throneburg to schedule the meeting.
- + Early Decision applicants will be notified of acceptance by Dec 15.

SPRING DECISION APPLICATION

- + Apply and be accepted to EIU by April 1

EARLY ADMIT TO GRAD SCHOOL FOR EIU JUNIORS

STUDENT DECISION & ENROLLMENT PROCESS FOR ADMITTED STUDENTS

- + EIU students who did not participate in the Direct Admission to Graduate School Program as a senior in high school can apply for EARLY ADMISSION to EIU's graduate program when their 3000-level courses are completed in April of their junior year.
- + EIU CDS students with an interest in attending EIU's CDS graduate program who meet the following criteria are encouraged to apply for acceptance into the CDS Early Admit Graduate Program:
 - They have a 3.5 cumulative GPA and major GPA upon completion of 3000-level CDS courses.*
 - They have completed >60 hours of college credit by the end of the spring term.
 - They have met the Essential Professional Functions in Undergraduate Coursework minimum requirements.
 - They have submitted an application to the Graduate Admissions Committee by April 1 of their junior year consisting of: Written responses to a personal essay question and 3 short answer questions consistent the traditional application Resume that includes extra-curricular, service, leadership, and employment experience
- + EIU faculty advisors provide additional information to students about the program.
- + Review of applications will take place during May by the Graduate Admissions Committee. Final grades, as well as Essential Professional Functions, will be considered. Students will be notified of acceptance into the CDS Early Admit Program by June 1.



Speech Pathologists Can Apply for ISAC Scholarship

Students who are Illinois residents, attend public Illinois universities such as EASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY, and plan to work in the school setting in Illinois as a speech pathologist or other special education teacher after graduation, are eligible to apply for ISAC's Illinois Special Education Tuition Waiver

- ♦ The program that pays for tuition and mandatory fees for up to four calendar years in exchange for working in an Illinois school (public, private, non-profit, parochial) for 2 of 5 years after graduating
- ♦ Website is in picture below (isac.org) or search "Illinois Special Education Tuition Waiver"
- ♦ The application is typically available on the website in mid-December and must be submitted before March 1st
- ♦ Each year, ISAC awards 250 of these Special Ed tuition and fee waiver scholarships. If you are not selected by the July notification, apply again next year. The scholarship is good for up to 4 years, and can be used in grad school too. (All information obtained from www.isac.org)




EIU Speech Therapy Partnership with



Since 2023, Speech-Language Pathology/Communication Disorders & Sciences at Eastern Illinois University partners with Mico CARE Centre in Jamaica year-round to provide speech therapy services to children in Jamaica. There are fewer than 8 speech therapists in the country for 3 million people. Many children are on waiting lists and never receive services.

On-Line Speech Therapy

All EIU graduate student clinicians provide a rotation of on-line speech therapy to children in Jamaica with EIU faculty supervisors who are licensed in Jamaica and IL. Some undergraduates may participate with independent study



Being able to provide online services in a country where options are very limited is more rewarding than anything I've ever done. Learning about another culture, having a hands-on opportunity with on-line therapy and also, just the personal connection and getting to know my client and her mother was incredible!

EIU Students and Faculty on the Therapy Abroad trip stay at an AirBnB in a gated community with a swimming pool and a caretaker, one block from the beach. They also have time to experience the beauty of Jamaica

Speech Therapy Abroad

Each year, EIU undergraduate and graduate students have the opportunity to travel with EIU faculty to St. Ann's Bay Jamaica to provide evaluations and therapy at Mico CARE Centre.



This past week has been truly a life-changing experience that has taught me so many things about a new culture, and I was able to meet the most incredible kids, and work with the greatest people ever. Throughout the days we did therapy and evals at the school, I learned more than I ever could have imagined. Talking with the other American speech therapists that are working in Jamaica, I was able to learn about the endless options speech therapists have nationwide and internationally.
