## GENERAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES Tuesday, January 28 | 3:30-4:30 PM

- I. Heist called the meeting to order. Elder volunteered to take notes. Call for member to take minutes--Elder
- II. Heist announced that Spring 2024 Reports would be sent to CAA by Tuesday, February 11.
- III. Update on Spring 2025 materials: Heist will send link to Gen Ed shared folder for the committee's convenience. The files will be uploaded and organized under "Spring 2025" and divided by subject. Heist suggested that the committee check for completed folders as we go through the process; we can ask programs to supply missing materials as part of the review.
  - a. All submitted and scheduled except for:
    - i. Humanities Interdisciplinary Courses: The coordinator of that program, C.C.Wharram, teaches during our meeting times. There really is no one else who can represent the program. The committee discussed various options for an alternative presentation. It was decided that Heist will schedule a meeting at a different time and invite members of the committee who are available. That meeting will be recorded so everyone can review it.
    - ii. Medieval Studies (Julie Campbell): TABLED. Jeannie Ludlow (chair of CAA) and the provost agreed to table this because, since the retirement of the university's only medievalist, there is no one available to teach this course. Perhaps in the next cycle there will be a medievalist who can teach those courses.
    - iii. English (Angela Vietto): No word from English about scheduling this session.
- IV. GEC Reading Group: Members present agreed to table the discussion until the next meeting, Feb. 4, when we will discuss chapters 1 and 2.
