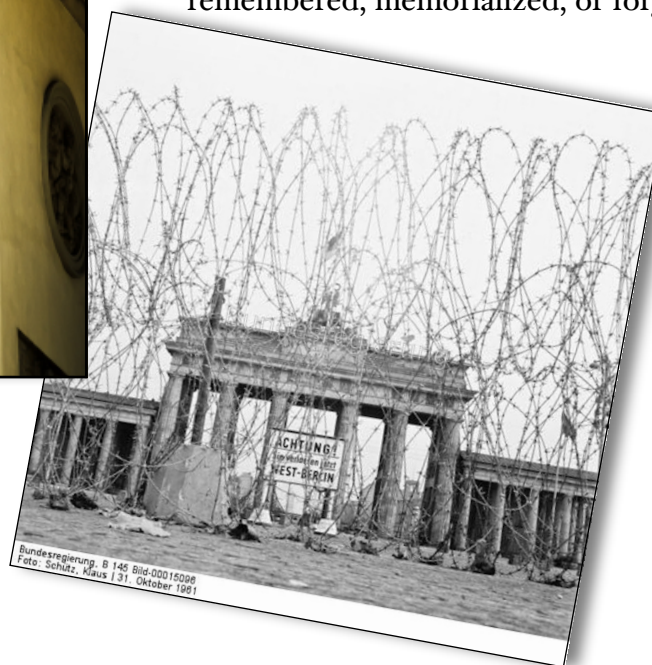

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- **3 Weeks in 2 German cities: Berlin (11 days) and Munich (10 days)**
- **Earn 6 credits**
- **No German Language Skills Required**
- **Our Guiding Study Question:** How did Germany transform itself within half a century from a racial, genocidal state under Nazism into the largest liberal democratic state in Europe? How did Berlin and Munich—capitals of the Nazi movement and Nazi regime—“come to terms” with their Nazi past?
- **Explore: Germany’s Landscape** of collective memory in and around Berlin, Munich, Dresden, Nuremberg, and Berchtesgaden. What is remembered, memorialized, or forgotten?



• **Experience:** Life in what are Germany’s most populous, pulsing, and vibrant cities. Find your favorite hip district, beer garden, or market.

• **Planned Day Trips:** Dresden; Dachau Concentration Camp Memorial; Nuremberg (site of Nazi Party rallies); Berchtesgaden in the Alps (Hitler’s Eagle’s Nest)
