Situated on 320 acres, EIU was founded in 1895 and originated as a teachers college, which speaks to our strong commitment and passion to the field of education. EASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY MUSIC DEPARTMENT

We have a thriving department with outstanding faculty, facilities, and most importantly, students! All music students work closely with a dedicated faculty of highly-skilled professional musicians and educators who are committed to providing the utmost in personal attention for every student. As a result, we have an outstanding record for job placements, and our graduates are respected leaders in all fields of music.

The Department of Music enrolls approximately 150 undergraduate and graduate students and is an accredited member of the National Association of Schools of Music. All undergraduate programs share a common set of core courses, which include applied study on your primary instrument or voice, ensembles, music theory, music history, and piano. From here each program branches out to provide specialization in an area of interest. All music majors take weekly hourlong lessons on their primary instrument or voice with a music faculty member, and all students participate in ensembles every semester, many play in more than one. Students frequently collaborate with one another in and out of the classroom, developing a spirit of cooperation and a shared love of music.

EASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY BANDS

The EIU Bands have been serving the University and its students since 1927 through a variety of ensemble experiences including 3 concert bands—Wind Symphony, Concert Band, Symphonic Band—Basketball Pep Band, and the Panther Marching Band as well as 2 jazz big bands and 3 jazz combos. Students of all majors are welcome and encouraged to participate in the various EIU bands. If you like to play a woodwind, brass, or percussion instrument, we have a place for you in one of the bands at EIU!

EIU PANTHER MARCHING BAND FESTIVAL CLASSIFICATIONS AND ADJUDICATION PROCESS

CLASSIFICATION

Classification is based on a hybrid system which varies from year to year depending on the natural breaks that occur when band and school enrollments are listed smallest to largest. Schools first determine which classification format they want to enter: Festival (none this year), Scholastic (12 bands) or Open (20 bands). Ensembles are then divided by the natural breaks in band size. IHSA School Classifications are used to divide ensembles into five different classifications (D, C, B, A, AA). This year, the IHSA classification and band size is then averaged together in a 1:1 ratio (because of five IHSA classes and five band classifications) and then classifications are formed. All classifications are set to ensure the fairest possible average between both IHSA classification and musician size classification.

ADJUDICATION

A panel of 9 judges will adjudicate the Festival:

- Music Performance Ensemble: Dr. Erica Neidlinger Pressbox
- Music Performance Individual: Matt Banks Sideline
- Music General Effect 1: Adam Hill Pressbox
- Music General Effect 2: Mike Madonia Pressbox
- Visual Ensemble: Jeff Fiedler Pressbox
- Visual Individual: David Knowlton Sideline
- Visual General Effect: Keith Baker Pressbox
- Percussion: Chris Groff Sideline
- Color Guard: Sammy Lawson Pressbox

Last year we changed our adjudication system for the 'Open Class' band to align more with the Bands of America system. The BOA system places 60% of the weight on the music scores and 40% on the visual scores. The color guard and percussion scores do not factor into the overall band competitive score other than the caption awards. Here is the breakdown of the overall scoring system:

20 points –	Music Performance Ensemble
20 points –	Music Performance Individual
	(both scores above are averaged to 20 points total or 20% of the final score)
20 points -	Visual Performance Ensemble

- 20 points Visual Performance Individual
 - (both scores above are averaged to 20 points total or 20% of the final score)
- **20 points –** Music General Effect 1
 - (this score will reflect 20% of the final score)
- **20 points –** Music General Effect 2
 - (this score will reflect 20% of the final score)
- 20 points Visual General Effect
 - (this score will reflect 20% of the final score)

For those bands who have chosen the 'Scholastic Class' option, Music General Effect 2 adjudicator transfers to the Music Performance Ensemble caption, Music General Effect 1 adjudicator provides comments only regarding the Music General Effect (no scores) and the Visual General Effect adjudicator transfers to the Visual Performance Ensemble caption. The total scoring systems is as follows:

20 points -Music Performance Ensemble 1 Music Performance Ensemble 2 20 points -(GE Music 2 adjudicator takes the role of Music Performance Ensemble 2) 20 points -Music Performance Individual (all three scores above total 60% of the final score) 20 points -Visual Performance Ensemble 1 20 points -Visual Performance Ensemble 2 (GE Visual adjudicator takes the role of Visual Performance Ensemble 2) (both scores above are averaged to 20 points total or 20% of the final score) 20 points -Visual Performance Individual (this score will reflect 20% of the final score) Music General Effect 2 0 points -(the Music GE 1 adjudicator will provide comments only regarding music GE)

WHAT AWARDS ARE OFFERED AT THE PMB FESTIVAL?

The following awards will be given in each competitive class:

- Class ranking trophy for each band in each class.
- Outstanding Music for the highest combined Music Performance scores in each class.
- Outstanding Visual for the highest combined Visual Performance scores in each class.
- Outstanding General Effect for the highest combined GE scores in each class.
- Outstanding Percussion and Outstanding Color Guard in each class.
- Grand Champion for the highest placing band in the 1A, 2A, 3A class and the 4A, 5A, 6A class.
- Grand Champion for the highest placing band in the Scholastic Class, Open C and D Class and the Open B, A and AA Class.

A MARCHING BAND COMPETITION IS VERY DIFFERENT FROM A SPORTING EVENT OR CONCERT.

There are different rules that we ask our audience to abide by, to help each band and audience member get the best experience possible. We have provided a small list of Do's and Don'ts that will help ensure the enjoyment of all and will help the competition run as smooth as possible.

- Do get to the show early to get a good seat. Sit as high and centered in the bleachers as possible, so you can get the full effect.
- Don't save a large number of seats for fans that are coming later. Seating is "First-Come-First-Served".
- + Do wear your school colors proudly!
- Don't talk during ANY band's performance!
- Do share and converse with those around you (even those from other schools) between bands.
- Don't move around during a band's performance. Wait until a performance has concluded, and the band is marching off the field to leave the stands.

- Do find the positives in each band's performance, and applaud their efforts.
- + Don't make negative comments while within ear-shot of other audience members. You never know who is sitting around you—it could be staff members, parents, or siblings of the performers on the field. If you must point out flaws, wait until the drive home!
- + Do applaud often. If the music moves you to show appreciation, show it! The performers will feed off that energy, and will, in turn, give a better performance!
- + Don't comment negatively on anyone's placement. Every band has worked hard and put in countless hours preparing for the performance you just experienced.
- Do enjoy the wonderful time and experiences you will have today.

REMEMBER

The adjudicators are professionals who are doing their best to judge a very subjective activity.



PARTICIPATION IN MARCHING BAND HELPS STUDENTS BECOME SO MUCH MORE THAN BETTER MUSICIANS.

Using data and scales from the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE), Dr. David Healy from Boston College compared the college engagement of members of 20 different college marching bands with data from the same colleges from non-marching band members. Comparing data from marching band members and non-marching band members, he found the following:

- + College marching band students are more likely than non-band students to work with faculty members on activities other than coursework including committees, orientation, and student life activities.
- + College marching band students are more likely than their non-band peers to participate in a community-based project (e.g. service learning) as part of a course.
- College marching band students are more likely than their non-band peers to have serious conversations with students

- of a different race or ethnicity as well as students who are very different in terms of their religious beliefs, political opinions, or personal values
- + College marching band students are also more likely than their non-band peers to examine the strengths and weaknesses of their own views on a topic or issue, try to better understand someone else's views by imagining how an issue looks from his or her perspective, and learn something that changed the way they understand an issue or concept.

UNIVERSITY BANDS

EIU WIND SYMPHONY

The Wind Symphony is the "flagship" ensemble of the band program, consisting of approximately 50 of our finest brass, woodwind and percussion performers by audition. They performs significant literature for winds that is drawn from the major masterworks of the repertoire for the modern wind band, including chamber literature. They are also actively involved in the commissioning of new works for wind band as well as exploring new approaches to programming/performing.

EIU CONCERT BAND

The Concert Band is a non-auditioned ensemble of approximately 45-50 musicians, both music and non-music majors, dedicated to broadening the artistic level and interest of its members while performing the music of artistic and historical significance. The ensemble performs 2-3 concerts in the fall and spring.

EASTERN SYMPHONIC BAND

The Eastern Symphonic Band consists of approximately 45-50 woodwind, brass, and percussion players. This ensemble only meets one night per week, so the time commitment is minimal. Made up of mostly non-music majors, a few community members, and some music education majors playing secondary instruments, this group provides a wonderful performance outlet for non-music majors with a minimal time commitment.
