Pathways to Achievement, Confidence, and Knowledge (PACK) Program

The Pathways to Achievement, Confidence & Knowledge (PACK) program provides students with individualized attention during their first year at Eastern. Through the PACK program, at-promise students who may not have the standard academic credentials can find their own pathway to achievement, confidence, knowledge, and success!

PACK students work with Senior Academic Advisors and peer educators, as well as participate in cohort-based activities and events in a first-year experience designed with a growth-mindset model. Other expectations include:

- Enroll in courses determined in collaboration with a Senior Academic Advisor
- Enroll in EIU 1111: EIYOU during first semester at EIU
- Attend all classes, meetings, and participate in student success activities
- Attain a 2.0 GPA in the Fall and Spring semesters
- Attain 20 credit hours for the academic year
 - If a student falls below a 2.0 GPA in either of their first two semesters, they may have to continue to follow all the PACK Program expectation in year two.

Academic Alert System

The <u>Academic Alert System</u> at Eastern Illinois University is designed to promote opportunities for growth through academic challenges.

Faculty members can use the Academic Alert System to connect students with academic support services, peer educators, and more.

The Academic Alert System is an opportunity for growth, and faculty are asked to use the system as an intervention at any point in the semester, but the earlier, the better.

- Faculty are encouraged to communicate with the student prior to the AAS
 referral and using this as an opportunity for growth
- Academic Support Center peer educators are trained on a national model for peer education and Mental Health First Aid
- Support is built on a solutions-focused, growth-oriented, individualized plan
- The Academic Support Center works with campus partners in Student Affairs for integrated referral and resource partnerships





EIU 2919: Strategies for Academic Success

<u>EIU 2919: Strategies for Academic Success</u> is designed for students placed on academic warning for the first time. With comprehensive skill development and self-reflection, students explore essential strategies for academic recovery and success.

The learning objectives of this course include:

- Create measurable academic goals to foster long-term achievable goal setting.
- Evaluate personal academic performance to foster continuous improvement.
- Analyze academic and career-related challenges to enable future academic and professional success.
- Demonstrate effective verbal and written communication skills.
- Utilize university resources and support services to access and leverage support.
- Implement weekly time management strategies to balance academic responsibilities and personal commitments.
- Apply note-taking methods across various course subjects.
- Develop a growth mindset and resilience for future obstacles.
- Develop the skills to analyze and assess financial information.





Interdisciplinary Studies Program (IDS)

B.A. in Interdisciplinary Studies at EIU serves adult learners helping them meet their goal of earning a bachelor's degree.

- Students may develop an individualized degree program to meet their professional and personal goals
- Career-focused with success across numerous professions including business, non-profits, law enforcement, education and health care
- Student-focused with flexible course schedules and instructional modalities that promote success
- In-state tuition, textbook rental and opportunities for scholarships
- Credit for Life Experience for learning through lived experience outside the traditional classroom, including on the job and in the military.

IDS also serves the population at the Danville Correctional Facility, partnering with the Illinois Department of Corrections.

Office of Accessibility & Accommodations (OAA)

The purpose of the disability accommodation process is to ensure a qualified student is not discriminated against solely on the basis of disability and has the same level of access to EIU as their nondisabled peers. The goal is equal access and equal opportunity, not to facilitate a specific accommodation.

- Ensure qualified students with disabilities have equal opportunity to participate in all university programs
- Provide reasonable accommodations and auxiliary aids tailored to individual student needs
- Facilitate barrier removal through individual consultation and strategic campus partnerships
- Conduct consistent outreach to promote accessibility awareness across the university community

The Office of Accessibility and Accommodations collaborates with the Faculty Development and Innovation Center on accessibility and academic accommodation support for faculty across the university.

TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) is a federally funded program designed to help low-income, first-generation, and students with disabilities succeed in college.

The goal of TRIO/SSS at Eastern Illinois University is to increase retention and graduation rates of eligible students and to foster an institutional climate supportive of the success of low-income and first-generation college students and/or college students with disabilities. TRIO/SSS provides a range of academic and personal support services to help students stay in school, graduate, and enter careers ready to succeed.

We accomplish this mission by providing intentionally targeted services, including:

- Educational outreach ensuring equal access
- Supportive environments motivating degree completion
- Targeted services increasing academic development
- Professional growth enhancing career competitiveness

Testing & Evaluation Operations (TEO)

Testing & Evaluation Operations (TEO) is responsible for two testing labs in McAfee, scoring and reporting of campus Scantron testing, managing the course evaluation program, coordination of placement testing for incoming students, outside exam proctoring for other colleges/universities, and program assessment and evaluation support for the campus community.

Our testing labs have been updated to support procedures that follow the highest academic standards. TEO staff members work with faculty to meet their testing expectations, proctor and administer exams, and facilitate the distribution of the results. Both testing labs have been equipped with brand new accessible workstations for students registered with the Office of Accessibility and Accommodations.

- Supports the university's educational mission through high-quality testing and exam scoring services
- Provides professional, secure, and accessible testing environments for students, faculty, and staff
- Offers comprehensive evaluation and survey services that advance learning opportunities
- Assists with assessment measures designed to promote academic success in higher education settings

<u>EIYOU</u> provides the building blocks for academic excellence at EIU. Students actively participate in areas of student success including navigating the university, building college success skills, creating college support networks, finding your future path and career, financial wellness, academic technology, and student social, physical, and emotional wellbeing.

After completing this course, students will be able to:

- Navigate university systems for success
- Apply critical thinking across contexts
- Develop comprehensive resource collections effectively
- Curate meaningful professional relationship networks
- Implement effective academic success strategies
- Articulate educational and career objectives
- Implement personal financial management strategies

EIYOU is required for all incoming full-time on-campus students with less than a 3.00 high school GPA, but open to all incoming full-time on-campus freshmen, transfer, and returning students.
